**2010 ITF WORLD CHAMPIONS**

The ITF has announced the names of the 2010 ITF World Champions. The ITF World Champions are based on an objective system that considers not only performances at the Grand Slams, Olympic Games and respective tours, but also gives weight to performances in the two ITF international team competitions, Davis Cup by BNP Paribas and Fed Cup by BNP Paribas.



**Men's & World Champion - Rafael Nadal (ESP)** received the title for the second time.

**Women's World Champion - Caroline Wozniacki (DEN)** became the fourth-youngest woman to earn the year-end No. 1 ranking. She is the first Danish player to receive the title.

**Men's Doubles World Champions - Bob and Mike Bryan (USA)** for a record seventh occasion.



**Women's Doubles World Champions - Gisela Dulko (ARG) and Flavia Pennetta (ITA)** became the Doubles World Champions for the first time.



**Junior World Champions-** Both Youth Olympic champions **Juan Sebastian Gomez (COL)** and **Daria Gavrilova (RUS)** receive the honours.



**Wheelchair World Champions-** **Esther Vergeer (NED)** becomes world champion for a remarkable 11th successive year while **Shingo Kunieda (JPN)** wins the award for the fourth running year.

The ITF World Champions will receive their awards at the annual ITF World Champions Dinner on Tuesday 31 May, in Paris, during Roland Garros.

**2011 HYUNDAI HOPMAN CUP**

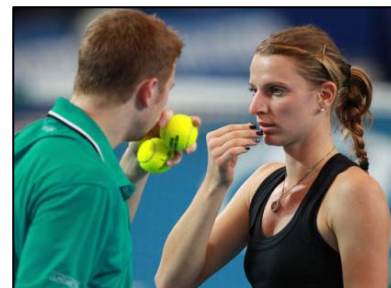
A \$ 1,000,000 Hyundai Hopman Cup XXIII was held at the Burswood Entertainment Complex, Perth, Australia from 1 - 8 January 2011. A male and a female player from eight nations are invited to play the round robin of two groups of four, with the winning team in each group plays off in the Final. The event is recognized by the ITF, the governing body of the sport, which provides the ongoing stability to the event.

**ITF 14 & UNDER ASIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS 2011- GROUP 2**

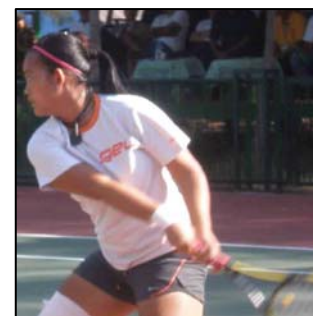
Myanmar Tennis Federation hosted the ITF 14 & Under Asian Championships for the third time at Yangon from 24<sup>th</sup> Jan - 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 2011. Players from 16 nations - **BAN, BHU, LAO, MAS, MDV, MGL, NEP, PAK, SIN, SRI, VIE, West Asian ITF Team and host MYA** with 80 participants participated in the two-week event, making it the highest number since the inception of this event in 1994.



The championship consisted of two, four day tournaments with the feed in consolation format. Points were awarded for each tournament, to provide the final ranking. This point ranking determines who will qualify to be on the ITF Team (Group 2). The team then participates in the next ITF development event (Group 1) to be held on March 21 in Indonesia.

**In the boys events** Ghassan Al-Ansi of Yemen did his nation proud by winning the single titles of both tournaments. He beat Issac Ong (SIN) in tournament one and Mohd. Delwar Hossain (BAN) in tournament two respectively. The Syrian pair Kareem Allaf and Mohammad Azhari bagged the double titles of both tournaments.

**In the girls category** Nilar Win of Myanmar was a class above the rest of the field. She bagged the girls singles and doubles titles in both tournaments. In the doubles she paired with Shaema Al-Olfi (YEM). In both the singles finals she defeated Geraldine Ang of Singapore.



The closing ceremony and prize distribution was organized in spectacular fashion. The championships received a great deal of support from the government of Myanmar as well as local sponsors. The TFM center, the venue for the championship was thronged daily with spectators as well as with the media people.



ITF development officer for Asia, Suresh Menon remarked, "many of the players in this competition are from the ITF assisted Junior Tennis Initiative (JTI) program. It is exciting to know that Nilar Win of Myanmar was first exposed to tennis through this program. The same can be said for a number of other players in the tournament. The ITF initiated programs continue to produce results in a number of Asian Nations".

### **TENNIS 10S' WORKSHOP, IRAN**

The I.R. Iran Tennis Federation organized the Tennis 10's campaign in support with the ITF Play+Stay. The workshop was held at the Iran Broadcasting International Conference Center (IICC) in Tehran from 26-27 January 2011 to introduce the ITF Tennis 10s' Project to the coaches.



The workshop was attended by 126 tennis coaches and teachers. The education material was translated into Persian language for the convenience of the participants.

Apart from great planning, advertisement, organization, valuable technical content, attractive opening and closing

ceremonies, TV coverage, etc. the workshop was conducted in very professional manner.



### **LEVEL 1 COACHES COURSE, GIMCHEON, KOREA**

Korea Tennis Association's (KTA) in conjunction with ITF organized its second Coaching Beginner & Intermediate Players Course from 8-15 January 2011. The course was conducted by the ITF expert and Development Officer for Asia. A total of 18 coaches participated which included some of the most experienced coaches from elementary, middle and high schools. The course participants also included former top players of Korea.

In order to take ownership of future coaches' education program, the KTA organized a tutor's course prior to the coaches' course. Suresh Menon conducted the course with Korean tutors Han Min Kyu, Lee Jeong Myung, Lee and Jung Sok.



The participants spent nine days trying to master all aspects of beginner/intermediate tennis which included topics - technique, tactics, psychology, fitness training, coaching diagnosis and correction, communication, etc. The course material was translated into Korean and 2 translators were also present throughout the course.

**Joon Ho Rhee, Vice President of Player Development and Coaching for KTA** was pleased with the response. He made the following comments regarding the course, "Plans are already underway to organize a third course to be conducted by the local tutors. The KTA is also planning to organize an advanced coach's course at the end of the year and also identify coaches that will participate in the ITF World-Wide coaches' conference. "

#### **KELLMAYER SET FOR HALL OF FAME**

Fern Lee "Peachy" Kellmeyer has been elected for induction to the International Tennis Hall of Fame in the Contributor Category. Kellmeyer was the very first employee and director of the WTA in 1973 and still serves the organization today. She is being recognized for her work towards the growth of the women's game and in improving rights for female athletes across all sports.

After talented junior and collegiate careers as a player, she joined the WTA and in her time there led the WTA's operations, player and tournament relations and has been involved in all major policy decisions. She is currently WTA Operations Executive Consultant, and is also a member of the ITF Fed Cup Committee. Kellmeyer joins Recent Player inductee Andre Agassi as the ITHF Class of 2011. Their Induction Ceremony will be held on 9 July at the International Tennis Hall of Fame & Museum in Newport, RI, USA.
